





Imagine being part of grand parade of Panathenaic Festival, held every yr (see here). procession started @ Athens' city gate (near Keramikos CEM), passed >> Agora, **THEN**, around Mars Hill, >> CNTR hall of Propylaea, & up > glorious bldg atop Acropolis. 

STAT & carved reliefs decorated Parthenon EXT, NOW, faded or missing, except few. Look up @ crossbeam atop eight COL, decorated w/ panels of relief carvings called "metopes," depicting Athens battling Amazons . ORIG, 92 Doric-style metopes in high relief, mostly designed by Pheidias himself. **crossbeams** supported triangular pediment (now gone). **area** once filled in w/ STAT, showing Athena w/ her olive tree & w/ Poseidon & trident competing > be Athens' patron god. TODAY, just 1 STAT remains (& reconstruction).

all remains: earlier Parthenon destroyed after Persian invasion of 480 B.C. Persians razed entire Acropolis, including unfinished TEMP THEN, under

GRK Flag

blue-&-white GRK flag's 9 stripes symbolize 9 syllables of GRK phrase 4 "Freedom or Death."; new meaning when Nazis entered Athens in April 1941. According > oft-repeated (but unverified) story, Evzone (select infantry unit) guarding flag flying here ordered by Nazis > remove it. BUT, instead Evzone soldier wrapped himself in flag & jumped off Acropolis, died, hero.







Royal Origins (Interesting history)

-- **King William II " Good**," grandson of Roger II idea; Prior: stood sm Arab hamlet named "Ba'lat,": local farmers would gather morn > cart produce > souks of Bal'harm (Palermo).

Norman era: Ba'lat area renamed Monreale, Hauteville monarchs favorite hunting ground; deer, boar & wild cats; far more forests than now; falconry popular w/ baronage; hue, extensive royal hunting reserve

-- Walter "of Mill" glish bishop of Palermo("Offamilias" = familial connection > Hauteville kings), w/other nobles tried > influence / persuade young king > give them more power; reduce Muslim ministers / functionaries powers; formerly child-William's tutor during mother's regency; kingdom actually controlled by Matthew d'Aiello, royal chancellor, & Walter, bishop of Palermo

BUT, young Willie evidenced power by constructing CATH; Benedictines readily obliged. Crowned @ 18 (1171), King William's 1st goal: establish actual control/power >self firmly as sovereign, so CATH began, 1172: 4 yr > build; mosaics & cloister done by young king's 1189 death

-- **Muslims** fled Palermo > hill country capital after **rebellion** against William's father in 1161others already lived there. **anti-Muslim policy**, led by Matthew Bonellus, Siculo-Norman nobility, leaving 'Saracens' (DEF: nomadic people of deserts btwn Syria & Arabia) > establish easily-fortified towns in INT, though nominally loyal > William, eventually Bonellus eliminated; Ft-like CATH (TOW & slit-windows) strategically guarded gateway passes > these communities; nearby hilltop castle of Castellaccio added STRAT support.

Arabs eventually rebelled, after King William's death, cuz William II & Pope-placed Abbot of Monreale's mistreatment & excessive taxation. Muslims on several occasions attacked CATH: worst -- 1216, BUT never serious threat > Norman, Swabian (DEF: Christian from southwestern <u>Germany</u>) Sicily. In 1246, last resistance.

3rd CATH construct goal: establish Roman Catholic CHR, aka "Latin" CHR, as official Sicily CHR.

12th **C**: many Orthodox Christians & Muslims, few Jews; Orthodoxy permitted, BUT Pope trumped, so despite Orthodox mosaic icons CATH 4 'Latinizing' of Sicily.

Pope Alexander III granted abbot of Benedictine MON episcopal privileges in 1174, & elevated Teobald > rank of archbishop in 1183.

little but cloister survives, originally: twelve embattled TOW & thick walls, some visible TOW

HIST: Built, 1174; 1177, at twenty-4, William married Joan, daughter of King Henry II of England & became brother-in-law > Richard I "Lionheart" & John "Lackland," Henry's sons. In 1170, King Henry II murdered Thomas Becket, Archbishop of Canterbury: Canonized in 1173,

William's un-Christian-like practices: 4

Middle Ages monarch: 1) many Muslim ministers, astrologers & doctors, 2) kept PAL harem, 3) spoken, read & written Arabic.

1189, completed before William's 1189, death (36): THEN< quasianarchy.

- GRKs intermarried Elymians, but not Sicanians: considered barbarians.

Context: GRK <u>Selinunte</u> colony, sixty km S Irg & prosperous since 650 BC alarming/threatening Segesta ALSO, Carthaginians, Mozia > Marsala> Solunto, saw GRK as threat, SO, Segesta allied w/ Carthage. BUT, after great GRK victory over Carthaginians at Himera, 480 BC, Segestans quickly changed sides allied w/ Athens







- Endlessly winding MED ST & tiny passages, ice cream bars, secluded gardens behind stone walls or on terraces or in public pleasant squares. evenings enchanting 4 strolling or coast views; NTM, Mount Etna rarer spectacles; lava flows on snow-covered slopes w/ stream of steam & light, eternal stone walls, ARCH monuments & MED homes.

Palazzo Santo Stefano: Mag sea views: most famous overlooking

Greco-Roman amphitheatre: OO Sicily's largest, w/ Mount Etna & sea in background; *HIST:*

- Settled by nearby <u>Naxos</u> GRK people, 395 BC, on Siculian city; had fled Dionysius Elder tyranny, who eventually conquered Taormina, 392 BC; named Tauromenion, 358 BC, regionally politically IMP 4 2 Cs.
- Supported Pyrrhus, King of Epirus, against Syracuse in 278 BC: w/ ten thousand troops.
- Supported Rome in Punic Wars when Eunus (slave/Slave Revolt) took city, BUT Romans finally conquered & massacred thousands of slaves.
- Julius Caesar's time: flourished, only > suffer under Octavian, who punished city 4 support of Pompey by expelling most peeps giving homes > Roman soldiers ; Romans prospered; surviving Rome's Fall, but IMP diminished.

"Saracen" castle: DIRECS: atop Mount Tauro

built on an older Byz structure, later Norman enlarged.



Another Ft: on still higher ground in Castelmola district.

DIRECS: **On foot**, take steps ascend > sanctuary (or convent) of Madonna della Rocca: reached from ST behind & above CHR of Saint Joseph (San Giuseppe) off 1 of Taormina's main squares. Presumes: good condition -- bring water)

Area's ancient ST plan EVID & ancient villas: w/ Roman mosaic FLRs.

Taormina's ST: retain MED flavour, as do CHRs & residences.

- **bell-TOW:** 60m/197ft, reconstructed using old designs, w/ OO greatest astronomical clocks, by Strasbourg firm: Ungerer (1933); every day at noon, figures are set in motion & show:
 - -- scenes from history of Messina, including: handing-over of legendary <u>letter of protection from</u> Madonna > Messina.

Myth: she gave letter > Messinan diplomats in Nazareth, in she wrote: "We bless you & city".

DIRECS: in Messina CATH TOW @ Piazza Duomo, 98122 Messina

STRAT: **IMP**: be there 10 min before noon 4 full show last 15 min, but pretty repetitive. ; Get **directly in front**, but w/ shade , if possible





HIST POINT: took place @ cliffs, 1797, OO worst invasion plans in wrld HIST in form of Colonel Tate, Anglo Amer heading French Revolutionary Invasion Force, ironically aa 'Legion Noire'; 1400 peeps: ½ +: disinterested convicts & conscripts who, blown off course, thus, even less happy @ landing in "godforsaken" spot; "loose plan": group wud link up w/ Welsh rebels & create chaos & anarchy in UK – BUT, found little of either; "army" looted few isolated farms on headland --- all stocked full of liquor "liberated" from recent shipwrec -- & got drunk & disorganised; several hundred of "invaders" desserted @ 1st opportunity. THEN, local farm workers force armed w/ little more than sticks rounded up rest who already in mass retreat having mistaken distant group of Welsh Women in tall hats > be crack force of advancing troops. Now wet, cold & sobered up, hapless French invaders hurriedly surrendered on beach & Britain saved (!)

*** Commemorated in **nearby Fishguard** local heroine, Jemima Nichols -- local farmers wife who single handedly captured 12 of hapless soldiers armed only w/ her pitchfork.

THEN, having crossed **old stone rd bridge** return > open ocean @ **Castle Point** w/ **impres ruined Ft** still sporting set of 3 cannons standing guard over harbour entry; since 1781 > protect town against pirate raiders after TOWN held 4 ransom by Amer born buccaneer: BLK Prince. Fishguard forced > pay him off after he threatened > subject town > all day bombardment from sea.

THEN, Diving in & out of bracken slopes & hawthorn tunnels pass above **Needle Rock huge oval stack** looking like top of long submerged stone needle, base punctured by **huge natural sea arch** giving needle eye. only habitation on section **caravan park @ Penrhyn** – normally scourge of coastal environment -- actually hugely impres clinging > top of narrow promontory, caravans literally teetering above abyss below.

avenue of ancient woodland accompanies > sea level > cross idyllic cove of Aber Bach where **wooden footbridge** takes over sm lagoon formed by shingle ridge bank. It's isolated place pinned in by narrow corridor of cliffs from wider ocean.

Snaking climbs & descents take > Pwll Gwylog, beautiful little horseshoe bay receives tumbling

mt stream, time in> L amphitheatre of huge cliffs wild & windswept as horizontal growing trees demonstrate – see them > believe me! oval shaped hump of Dinas Isle, now no longer cut off from mainland, stretches out like angry fist from beyond ruined limekiln @ Pwllgwaelod beach & challenge on horizon.

@ Pwllgwaelod will find defiant & very welcome Old Sailors Restaurant @ back of bay holds nothing but handful of fishing boats.



Past days gone by guiding lights placed after dark in windows here 4 ships > navigate by & avoid destruction on Dinas Head.

ideal lunch stop w/ end of wrld views.

@ inland end Dinas Head Isle severed from both sides by Cwm Dewi, deep glacial meltwater channel scythes across headland & now provides deep lush VAL & haven 4 butterflies, song birds, Falcons, grass snakes, Irg population of Dinas Rabbits & other assorted wildlife shelter here from ravaged headland. can see R across "isle" @ Dewi & could shortcut in 20 min but 4 PemCP walker there

only 1 way on, > start switchback climb heading 4 heavens & heights of Dinas Head .

It's all big skies, big slopes & big views as wind >> heather, bracken & gorse & couple of disheartening false summits before finally reaching trig point @ Pen y Fan on tip of Dinas Isle @ around 460ft. IF winds let linger @ top can see R back > Strumble Head & onwards > very end of PemCP @ mighty Cemaes Head. Inland



mysterious & menacing Preseli Hills loom above whilst far below ft look out > sea 4 pods of dolphins can sweep past extremity. Like hanging on> bow of Titanic it's breathtaking spot just opens up > rest of wrld.



It's quick & welcome descent on northern flank of Dinas Head w/ nimble traverse down middle of huge bracken covered ski slopes. @ times it's **rather daunting trail clinging above huge drops below > ocean**. **2nd Needle Rock** emerges, time ledges writhing w/ squawking Shags, Razorbills & Fulmars circle isolated stack outcrop in constant battles 4 best spot > nest.

Finally sudden drop >> lush woodland of hazel, hawthorn & stunted oaks & ash, reveals beautiful beach & hamlet @ Cwm-yr-

Eglwys on other side of Dewi Meltwater VAL.

Translating as " VAL of CHR", sitting here above perfect little beach stark & iconic single W wall & lonely bell TOW of 12Th C Sailors Chapel of ST Brynach., along w/ part of graveyard all grt storm of 1859 L standing after week long battering saw 114 shipwrecks & loss of over 500 lives across Welsh Coastline. lush vegetation & solitary Pines seem positively MED after Dinas Head, opposite from ferocity of storm destroyed CHR & swept away graveyard.



next section splendid cliff top march **in>** <u>Newport</u> broken only @ twin inlets of Aberfforest & AberRhigian where steep little wooded valleys tumble in> ocean. Tranquil little freshwater lagoons protected here by hefty shingle bars crossed on little wooden footbridges & complete idyllic hidden cove scene.

ragged cliffs con't until turn corner in> estuary @ Newport & drop >> boathouses & little cottages > reach Parrgog (Beach) @ head of estuary where River Nyfer snakes way past Newport > sea.

There fine views across ' Bennet', golden sand



bar guides rushing waters of Nyfer in> ocean. <u>final diversion inland</u> <u>below Preseli Hills > reach Newport</u> now follows salt marshes of estuary >> thick woodland > **old Iron Bridge crossing**. On way, <u>long abandoned boats</u> lie in snaking seawater inlets & sheltered marshy pools - haven of wildlife & waders.







Interesting bridges over River Clyde: DIRECS: City Centre.

- **PED Bridge: DIRECS:** crosses river E of M8 motorway, aka "Squiggly Bridge" cuz distinctive S-shape.,
- Kingston Bridge: DIRECS: Nearby; carries M8 motorway across Clyde, 1969, BUT, far more spectacular > stand beneath than drive over, w/ almost CATH-like vista & strange aura of calmness betrays likely traffic chaos going unseen directly above head.
- Clyde Arc: DIRECS: Further W; aka "Squinty Bridge", relatively new & prominent bridge ; elegant curved design & unique cuz crosses river @ angle.

Clyde Auditorium, DIRECS: Exhibition Way (TRN: Exhibition Centre), 2 +44 141 248 3000,

Barras Mkt (<u>Barras</u>): **DIRECS:** in E End of Glasgow; operation since turn of C; everything including cheap household items -- not place 4 antiques , BUT: grt place > walk >> & see different side of Glasgow away from usual tourist spots; grt atmosphere.
